- Unstable funding and increased accountability
- Changing landscape of the aging population
- Bifurcated social work/health care system
- Lack of federally supported infrastructure
- Lack of a standardized approach to investigation and assessment
- Event/allegation driven approach
- Lack of outcome measures

APS Framework: Progressive Nature of Abuse/Neglect


• Worsens over time without appropriate intervention


- Designed by social workers for social workers
- Follows social work practice
- Contains agreed-upon terminology for consistency
- Forms a client profile based on cluster of elements
- Guides, but does not direct
- Documents the work of the APS social worker
- Measures progress toward goal: to improve, stabilize or reduce the rate of decline in safety, stability and health
- Measures prognosis of recurrence
- Measures an agreed-upon goal to eliminate or reduce the protective issue

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The Ventura County APS Model

- Regularly scheduled Supervision
- Curb-side consulting
- Regularly scheduled MDTs
- Integrated medical/social work
- Use of evidenced based tools
- TRIO
- Robust case management system



TRIO Outcomes November 1, 2011 to September 5, 2014



Statistically significant differences found using chi-square test (p<.01)

180-Day Recidivism by Prognosis

Prognosis for recidivism (evaluated at case closure) and actual 180-day APS recidivism were closely related
