"Verbal Abuse"

means the use of words, sounds, or other communication including, but not limited to, gestures, actions or behaviors,

by a caretaker or other person providing services to a vulnerable adult

Verbal Abuse

that are likely to cause

- a reasonable person
 - to experience
 - humiliation
 - intimidation,
 - fear
 - shame or
 - degradation

Lessons Learned

Victim's fear: What will you do *to* me, rather than *for* me?
Abusers are more powerful to the victim than interventionists

Victim Indicators

- > Hypertension
- Significant weight loss or gain
- > Dizziness
- > Sleeplessness
- Sadness, <u>depression</u>, confusion




(more) Victim Indicators

> Is emotionally upset

> Withdrawn, non-responsive

> Exhibits unusual behavior

> Reports being verbally abused

"Verbal abuse" means the use of words, sounds, or other communication including, but not limited to, gestures, actions or behaviors, by a caretaker or other person providing services to a vulnerable adult that are likely to cause a reasonable person to experience humiliation, intimidation, fear, shame or degradation.


